<p>18-24 months</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Follows commands with spatial concepts, "put it IN the box" <input type="checkbox"/> Responds to yes/no questions <input type="checkbox"/> Understands verbs (eat, sleep) <input type="checkbox"/> Follows commands w/out gestures (you only say the command) <input type="checkbox"/> Listens to simple stories during reading time <input type="checkbox"/> Points to named items <input type="checkbox"/> Imitates others' behaviors and gestures 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Says between 10 words at 18 months - 300 words at 24 months <input type="checkbox"/> Starts to combine 2 words together <input type="checkbox"/> Names familiar objects <input type="checkbox"/> Says own name <input type="checkbox"/> Asks, "what's that"? <input type="checkbox"/> Imitates words more frequently and clearly <input type="checkbox"/> Starts to answer basic questions verbally

<p>24-30 months</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Listens to a 5 minute story <input type="checkbox"/> Follows 2 step related commands <input type="checkbox"/> Identifies actions in pictures <input type="checkbox"/> Understands pronouns "I" & "You" <input type="checkbox"/> Understands quantity words like "one" and "all" <input type="checkbox"/> Consistently points to named objects in a book 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Uses between 50 words (minimum at 24 months) to 500 words around 30 months <input type="checkbox"/> Starts using plurals & -ing verbs <input type="checkbox"/> Uses a few pronouns ("my" or "I") <input type="checkbox"/> Combines 2-3 words together <input type="checkbox"/> Answers what and where ?'s <input type="checkbox"/> Begins to ask what/where ?'s
<p>30-36 months</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Listens to a 10-15 minute story <input type="checkbox"/> Follows 2-3 step commands <input type="checkbox"/> Understand adjectives "big"/"little" <input type="checkbox"/> Understands many pronouns <input type="checkbox"/> Points to 10 objects described by use ("Point to the one you can EAT.") 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Uses between 250 words to 1000 words around 36 months <input type="checkbox"/> Uses past tense -ed verbs (walked) <input type="checkbox"/> Uses a variety of pronouns <input type="checkbox"/> Combines 3+ words together <input type="checkbox"/> Consistently answers wh- ?'s <input type="checkbox"/> Consistently asks wh- ?'s <input type="checkbox"/> Verbally expresses emotions <input type="checkbox"/> Names most familiar things & people <input type="checkbox"/> Can hold a basic conversation by 36 months

- Begins to comprehend *when, why, how* questions
- Understands time words- *when, before, after*
- Understands *same* and *different*
- Understands several quantity concepts - *one, some, rest, all, more, most*
- Makes inferences and comprehends verbal reasoning
- Ground objects and pictures by category
- Understands analogies
- Understands emotions and physical state words
- Receptively identifies all basic colors
- Understands names for basic shapes

- Speaks in 4-5 word sentences in conversation
- Names a variety of pictures
- Tells how an object is used
- Uses articles

- Complete analogies
- Describes items and differentiates by color, size, shape, and objects

48-60 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Understands words for order, like <i>first</i>, <i>next</i>, and <i>last</i>.<input type="checkbox"/> Understands words for time, like <i>yesterday</i>, <i>today</i>, and <i>tomorrow</i>.<input type="checkbox"/> Follows classroom directions, like “Draw a circle on your paper around something you eat.”<input type="checkbox"/> Hears and understands most of what she hears at home and in school.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Responds to “What did you say?”<input type="checkbox"/> Talks without repeating sounds or words most of the time.<input type="checkbox"/> Names letters and numbers.<input type="checkbox"/> Uses sentences that have more than 1 action word, like <i>jump</i>, <i>play</i>, and <i>get</i>. May make some mistakes, like “Zach gots 2 video games, but I got one.”<input type="checkbox"/> Tells a short story.<input type="checkbox"/> Keeps a conversation going.<input type="checkbox"/> Talks in different ways, depending on the listener and place. Your child may use short sentences with younger children. He may talk louder outside than inside.
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
